





A word from the CEO

This is the start of year two for me as CEO of the Town Council and it has been very gratifying to see so much progress made with support from Staff, Councillors and Volunteers.

The finances of the council are in good order and there is great transparency in accounting systems for every resident to see and to question and this is constantly updated by our RFO Steve Innes.

Events have increased in number and in popularity and more importantly in the professional way they are presented to the residents of the town. There is greater participation from community organisations, from local residents and from local business in all the activities of the town council which is essential to building strong communities. Our Civic Manager Toni Roast leads on many of these events and puts in many hours to ensure they are successful.

We are at the start of a Neighbourhood Plan project which requires input from every single resident in the town and which you are all encouraged to contribute to by attending public meetings. Town Council staff with local sports clubs are about to establish a Sports Forum which will help to attract more funding into the town for sports groups and provide generic training for all. We will be supporting clubs to reach Club Mark status which will demonstrate they are running correctly and that they provide adequate Child Protection for members.

Our new Parks Manager Ryan Hayman has provided many new activities in the park for all ages and will be adding to these in the coming year with the first Circus in town for many years.

We are not complacent in our approach to the services we provide and we welcome constructive comments about how we might improve our services to you. So please, if there is something we still don't have quite right let me know by writing or calling.

I am looking forward to yet another year with you all and the exciting opportunities which will be provided.

We have an exciting programme of community events lined up for you this year organised by the Town Council, so do please come along and I look forward to meeting many of you during my term of office.





Swanley Town Council is seeking to create a Neighbourhood Plan



What Plan Are We Talking About?

At local meetings there has been constant reference to various plans being developed for the town. It has got to a point now where there is some confusion over which plan is which as so we thought we would provide some clarity here:

Swanley Neighbourhood Plan

This is a plan for Swanley which is currently underway and will take around 12-18 months to complete with support from residents. This will help residents to put down in black and white how they would like the town to develop in the future and will help determine future housing. This plan is driven by the people of Swanley and Swanley Town Council

New Local Plan 2015-35

This plan is driven by Sevenoaks District Council and lays out the way the council operates and its plan for working across the district area for the next 17 years and is being updated from 2015. It sets out a variety of policies including housing, environmental and others strategies.

Swanley and Hextable Master Vision (Also referred to as Vision Plan)

This was a more detailed plan which outlined how many houses would be provided in the areas of Swanley and Hextable and an idea for a new Garden Village which would have seen the population of the town almost double. It was this plan that residents objected to and over 1800 of you voted against this plan which was subsequently suspended.
