A word from the CEO

I am now 9 months into my first year and it has proved to be challenging, informative and rewarding in taking care of the business of the town council. In March we took over the running of Park Activities for the first time ever and recruited 30 part time staff to assist with running activities.

While there is still much to do to improve facilities in the park local residents should feel pride in what Swanley has over many other town councils locally.

As a council we have been looking at smarter ways of working and creating new opportunities to support local clubs. We have had particular success here in supporting the first Rugby Club in Swanley who have had convincing wins during their first two matches.

We have supported two local football clubs and relocated the Boxing Club to provide a new facility for them at The Olympic and Swanley Athletics Club have moved into a new room with storage facilities provided.

We obtained £10,000 from Kent Police and Crime Commissioners Grant to provide activities for young people and we are still recruiting for this currently.

Armed Forces Day was a new event in the town calendar and was very well received with the cost being met by the Ministry of Defence, National Lottery and Cllr Michael Horwood via his County Councillor grant. We expect this event to grow each year and bookings are already being made for stalls and entertainers.

The 1812 night was hugely successful this year as we improved our advertising, benefited from great weather and brought in some community stalls. We hope that this event will grow annually and will continue to draw in crowds and thrill spectators.

I would like to say a big thank you to all the groups and individuals who have been working with the council and myself over the last 9 months and I hope more of you will come forward over the coming months to help us provide a range of activities for local residents.




A word from the Mayor Councillor Laurence Ball





Our host family made us feel very welcome, and delighted in showing us around the lovely town of Verrières.




Our very popular calendar, featuring photographs of bygone Swanley and area, has just gone on sale - £3.50 each or two for £6.00.
