A word from the CEO

What a great year it has been so far for all of at the Town Council with more people attending our events and lots of improvements being made to our facilities.

The Olympic has been re-decorated and is just awaiting new carpets while the Alexandra Suite has had new carpets and is awaiting redecoration (it's all about time available to get the work done).

While park activities are now winding down for the winter months there is still plenty going on to provide activities for residents and to prepare for next years visitors.

A new and larger Splash area will soon start taking shape alongside an expansion of the café facilities and a potential new kiosk next to the play area.

Planning permission is being sought to provide Swanley Rugby Club with a home off Leydenhatch Lane, which will allow them to become selfsustaining and encourage more players along.

This will include changing rooms and welfare facilities along with a kitchen/bar area so the supporters can enjoy a hot drink and a hot dog on those very cold days.

The Town Council has also won the Local Council Quality Award thanks to the work of its staff and councillors in attending relevant training and the way it runs your council.

This was along-side 4 awards for Swanley in Bloom and one Green Flag Award which also recognises the work carried out to enhance our open spaces and the flowers around the town.

There is always more to do and in 2020 we hope to win a second Green Flag for the town and to obtain the Local Council Gold Award for additional improvements.

We remain ready to engage with our residents and hope you will take advantage of our web site and social media pages to let us know your concerns.



D-Day

Local historian and now Town Councillor Andrew Skipper came up with an idea earlier this year to commemorate the 75th anniversary of D - Day and being a member of 593 Swanley Sqn Air Training Corp involved the local cadets.

Between Cllr Skipper and two of the cadets they organised and planned the event with Cadet Warrant Officer During and Sgt Swany both doing an amazing job of recreating the planning of D-Day alongside some action performances.

This was followed by the Act of Remembrance and a talk by veteran Mr Ted Needham who also spoke about his experiences and has since been awarded Freeman of the Town by the Mayor Cllr Lesley Dyball.

The whole event took place at the Link which has become host to various events over the last 3 years and which continues to develop its services to local residents.













The area will remain free of charge and will now incorporate a ramp to allow for disabled user access.

Work will be undertaken throughout winter and it is hoped that the Splash area will be open in time for the start of the 2020 season.

Additional park improvements are being considered, with more exciting changes due to be introduced for the start of next season.

Before the War Ted Needham lived in Swanley.

He joined the Royal Navy on 6th April 1943 and went straight to HMS Collingwood Naval Base to do his Radar Operators course.

He was then posted to the Isle

of Man for another course, after which he went to Arromanche in Normandy.

He was posted on the HMS Grenville this led him to take part in the D-Day assault ending up in Le Havre.

After D-Day he went back to the Isle of Man for a further course finally leaving the Royal Navy in September 1946, when he settled around the Crockenhill area working as hairdresser until 1993 and has now moved back to Swanley.

Mr Needham has been involved with the Royal British Legion for many years doing a variety of tasks including Poppy Collections.

Mr Needham now lives back in Swanley living his retirement.

Swanley enjoyed a multiple award winning event at this year's South & South East in Bloom award ceremony.

The award is part of Britain in Bloom and runs annual competitions to find the best Villages, Towns, Cities, Parks, Parishes, Town & City Centres, Urban Communities and Business Improvement Districts.

Swanley Town Council were entered into four categories, incredibly winning in all.

The Town Centre retained a silver award. Swanley Park Nature and Wildlife Reserve was entered for the first time and won silver gilt for the small conservation area of the year award.

Swanley Park was also entered for the first time and won the prodigious title of silver gilt for large park of the year.

Finally, Swanley Recreation Ground won a first honour, receiving the silver award for common of the year.

Park Director Ryan Hayman said 'It is an honour to collect these awards in front of industry experts and some of the best Parks in the country.

To go from winning one award to four is remarkable and credit must go to our staff for all their tireless efforts'.

The Town Council are always making improvements to the open spaces of Swanley. However, not all open spaces in Swanley are the responsibility of the Council.

It is hoped that going forward the Town Council would be able to assume responsibility for additional open spaces within Swanley, on the back of the continued success of our parks.

Sylvia Searles joined forces with me, after having lost her husband to cancer, then one by one, other ladies joined us, whose lives had also been touched by this horrible disease.

We all had great fun producing the calendar and we have all become great friends,6 If it gives some people help, both emotionally, financially and mentally, it has been so well worth doing, I'm still having ongoing treatment, but it's so very important to stay positive and strong.


