

I am hoping by the time this edition of the Town Crier has been published that we are well and truly in my favourite season of the year, bringing warmer days and . The budding trees are beginning to break into leaf, the daffodils have flowered in our parks and verges, the planted areas and troughs have provided splashes of colour and I think the town has looked particularly lovely this spring.

With spring in mind, many residents, businesses and pupils



from local schools took part in The Great British Spring Clean on 1st and 2nd March; an initiative which takes place all over the UK. We were out in force in a number of areas litter picking and Swanley had its own spring clean and tidy up. Over 3 tons was collected, and many of us who were out litter picking also reported dumped trolleys, fly-tipping and areas that needed more attention.

Swanley Park has undergone some major work during the winter months, and it is now ready to welcome the many visitors who enjoy our awardwinning park. The long-awaited renovations to the splash pool are now complete and a new water attraction, "The Plunge", is expected to be open at the end of April. In addition, we are in the process of building a soft play area which will complement the existing park attractions, particularly when the weather is wet and cold. I am also pleased to announce that two new pieces of wheelchair user play equipment a swing and a roundabout - have been installed in the children's playground.

Following on from the planting of over 600 trees to create Remembrance Wood in Swanley

Park, we are planning to plant hundreds more trees around the town. Not only do they bring interest and environmental benefits to the landscape but also they play a vital role in combatting pollution and improving our air quality.

Building on the success of last year when Swanley was awarded a Silver in the Best Town Centre category, we will again be entering the South East In Bloom competition and submitting several areas for consideration by the judges.

I am now in the final few weeks of my Mayoral year. It has been a busy one, and I have truly enjoyed meeting so many of you who contribute in so many different ways to the life of our town. I believe we are extremely fortunate to have such a vibrant and caring community, and it has been an honour and privilege to serve as your Mayor this past year.



A word from the CEO

There has been so much going on in Swanley that it's hard to recall everything we have been doing and I think the Mayor has covered many items in her introduction so I will concentrate on things still to come. But I would like to start by passing my thanks to all those residents who work with us and other groups around the town to improve the lives of everyone in Swanley. We could not achieve the things we have without the support of volunteers, local business and local organisations so a big pat on the back if you are one of those people.

You will all be aware that Whiteoaks Leisure is to be re-built by Sevenoaks District Council but the new facility maybe smaller than the existing one. So, the town council is working with

others to provide new sports halls at the Olympic site in the future and while primarily for basketball it will support many sports that will find themselves displaced from Whiteoaks. Additionally one of the barns at Swanley Park is to be converted for Community use and will provide some additional useable space for meetings and events. This will include some additional work on the café in the park to expand the kitchen facilities and provide more seating and counter top space.

We will shortly be undertaking a large piece of work on the pitch at the bottom and the park to ensure it drains properly and will be useable all year round and will include looking at funding to provide changing facilities there. At the request of town councillors I have asked that Sevenoaks District Council hand over all open space, play areas and parks in their control to Swanley Town Council and this has been agreed for the most part. One of those areas is Bartholomew Park and we will be making some small changes there to make the park more visible to passers by and encourage more use.

Some decorative changes will
be taking place in some
of our facilities with new
carpeting and lights for
the Alexandra Suite
to help modernise its
look and painting,
with wall changes at
the Olympic Suite.

Future developments in the town are being discussed by the Neighbourhood Planning Committee and Swanley Sports Forum and are all designed to engage with local residents and establish regular forums.

There is a new Community Rail Network being established between Swanley and Sevenoaks with the parishes of Eynsford, Otford and Shoreham al so involved in a joint project. The idea is to increase visitor numbers along the Darenth Valley with each of the towns and villages promoting what is unique to us to attract more tourists. We will be able to request additional carriages on trains between these stations for specific events such as our 1812, Armed Forces Day and Light up the Town events which will help generate additional income to offset these costs.

I would like to finish by thanking all my staff for embracing these changes and taking on new responsibilities which have reduced costs, improved services and made it a pleasure to work at Swanley Town Council.




St Georges Day 22nd April 2019

BROADSTAIRS Tuesday 9th July 2019

Broadstairs is one of Thanet's seaside resorts known as the 'Jewel in Thanet's crown'. The town lies above a harbour with cliffs on either side. It has seven bays of golden sand; Dumpton Gap, Louisa Bay, Viking Bay, Stone Bay, Joss Bay, Kingsgate Bay and Botany Bay.

The Dickers House museum is situated on the seafrent and displays.

The Dickens House museum is situated on the seafront and displays many artefacts relating to Charles Dickens and his life in Broadstairs. Crampton Tower by the railway station houses a museum that contains Thomas Russell Crampton's working drawings, models and graphics. The church of St-Peter-In-Thanet has one of the longest churchyards in England. Lunch can be purchased at a variety of eateries including traditional pubs, restaurants and cafes.

EASTBOURNE

Thursday 8th August 2019

With a seafront consisting largely of Victorian hotels, a pier and a Napoleonic era fort and military museum, Eastbourne was developed at the direction of the Duke of Devonshire from 1859 from four separate hamlets. Though Eastbourne is a relatively new town, there is evidence of human occupation in the area from the Stone Age. The town grew as a fashionable tourist resort largely thanks to prominent landowner, William Cavendish, later to become the Duke of Devonshire. Cavendish appointed architect Henry Currey to design a street plan for the town. The resulting mix of architecture is typically Victorian and remains a key feature of Eastbourne. Lunch can be purchased at the numerous restaurants and cafes that adorn the sea front.

RYE

Tuesday 3rd September 2019

During Rye's history the association with the sea has included providing ships for the service of the King during times of War. Rye also has close links with the smuggling gangs of the 18th and 19th centuries who used The Mermaid Inn and The Olde Bell Inn connected by a secret passageway. Rye being part of the Cinque Ports Confederation and a bastion against invasion on the Channel Coast, has always had close links with the crown. King Edward III and the Black Prince defeated the Spanish in Rye in 1350. Lamb House, one of the towns historic residences and now owned by the National Trust has been the former residence of the writers Henry James, Joseph Conrad, Stephen Crane and H.G. Wells. Lunch can be purchased at a variety of pubs and restaurants located within the town.
