#### **Events remain free for Swanley Residents**



Following a year of successful events in 2019 the Town Council has been looking at how these events can remain sustainable for the future.

As a result the Town Council will be introducing a £1 per person charge for two of its events in 2020 and those are the 1812 event and Bonfire Night.

While the charges will not pay for these events in their entirety it will help reduce the cost to the council while providing great nights of affordable entertainment for our residents.

Swanley residents are able to obtain a FREE parking permit for

parking in Swanley Park which lasts a year and this same ticket will now allow residents free entry into the events later in the year.

The Parking ticket can be obtained by visiting the Link with your driving licence, V5C and proof of address.

It is much more important this year that residents register for FREE PARKING as parking charges will apply ALL YEAR ROUND from April in the park and will be enforced through an ANPR system.

Charges will apply to ALL NON RESIDENTS of Swanley for daily parking in the park and for entry

to these two events during the year.

FREE parking in the park and FREE entry to events CANNOT be guaranteed if you have not registered so take advantage of this offer by visiting the Link.

If you are not a vehicle owner, further details on how Swanley residents can obtain their free tickets to 1812 in the Park and Fireworks on the Rec will follow later in the year

# DID YOU KNOW YOU ARE ENTITLED TO FREE PARKING IN SWANLEY PARK?

If you are a Swanley resident you are entitled to a FREE parking permit which can be obtained from the Link.

Simply take along proof of address, driving license and V5C and collect your permit.

It's much more important this year because we are going to introduce a charge £1 per person entry fee to 1812 and Bonfire Night to anyone who cannot show they are a resident of Swanley.

But if you have your permit you will get in for FREE

ANPR cameras are being installed at Swanley Park in March 2020 so don't get caught out because charges will apply ALL YEAR ROUND

This year will see new Splash facilities in the park with the town council investing over £350,000 in replacing the old pool in Swanley Park so there is more water and more jets and fountains to entertain the little ones.

The Woodlands has now been sold and some of this money will be used to improve existing

facilities and to increase the assets owned by the town council for sustainable future income. A new care facility will now be built on the site of the Woodlands which will hopefully provide future services for our older residents.

A new 'Doggie Day Care' facility is being prepared in Swanley Park that will care for pets while visitors play and where people can drop off pets for short periods and have them looked after at all times. We expect this to be ready before the start of the new season in April.

Last year we obtained the Local Council Award which recognises the professional way in which the town council is run and supports its staff and local residents. This would not have been possible if your locally elected councillors had not all attended training to ensure they fully understand their roles here. In the next few weeks we will be applying for the Gold Award which is the highest level that can be obtained by a Town Council of this size.



#### New Facilities for Swanley

There are significant changes planned for Swanley which will no doubt change the whole look of the town.

Town Developers U & I are to start re-building the shopping centre in 2020 and providing over 300 flats as part of their multi million pound investment in the town and the District Council are to spend £19 million on a new Leisure Centre.

If that wasn't enough the Town Council is hoping to provide a new Health Hub facility for the town as the current surgery it owns has been outgrown by local demand.

The Town Council has also just obtained planning permission to convert one of its barns into a Softplay facility which will open in the early part of 2020 along with new Rugby Field & Club facilities.

The CEO for Swanley Town Council Mr Steve Nash said 'some of these developments have not been well received by local residents so I am glad that it is the Town Council that are looking to provide facilities that local residents have asked for'.

A new £346,000 Splash Pool is currently being constructed in the park and is due to be ready for the start of the season in April 2020 in addition to extended toilet block and picnic tables around the park. (see photos below)

With the park now seeing around 3000 visitors a day during peak times it has been important for the town council to respond to this need.

One of the activities enjoyed by members of the Swanley and District U3A is a trip to the theatre, either a big West End blockbuster musical or a more intimate play. However, most of our trips are to the West End for evening performances as it is easy for members to make their own arrangements to visit local theatres such as The Orchard. Our London theatre trips also include coach travel from Hextable or Swanley, being dropped off and picked up right outside the theatre, and for those of us who enjoy a pre-theatre or interval tipple there are no worries about driving home.

Because we have a large membership, we are able to purchase group rate tickets at very advantageous prices and have the opportunity to purchase tickets for shows not yet open and therefore yet to be appraised by professionals or the general public. We recently bought tickets for Tina the Musical and 9 -5 before they opened, at less than half price, and by the time we went to see them it was almost impossible to get tickets!

One of the great things about being part of our theatre goers group is that both couples and singles can enjoy a theatre trip with like-minded people, and if you and your partner have different tastes in theatre, you know that you can go along on your own, but you won't be lonely.

We alert the group to special offers being made to U3A members as individuals and these not only give access to cheaper seats but often include a question and answer session afterwards with the cast.

We try to organise three or four trips a year with a variety of genres to ensure everyone's tastes are catered for. We don't meet as a formal group on a regular basis, but meet up for a very sociable time on the coach or chat over possible things to see during coffee at the monthly meetings and use the notice board at our monthly meetings to keep members informed of performances by our wonderful thriving local amateur theatres at, for example, the Edward Alderton in Bexleyheath or The Geoffrey Whitworth at Crayford and members bring advertising material for smaller amateur societies in which they may be involved.

So if you are no longer in full time employment and you enjoy the theatre, why not join us on the first Friday morning of the month at the Alexandra Suite Swanley and put your name down as a theatre goer, make new friends and see what other groups we have that may whet your appetite.

## Swanley Wildlife and Nature Group (SWAN)

### 'Creating habitats for wildlife and the community to enjoy in Swanley'

Swanley Town Council wanted to mark the Millennium in a permanent way, and it was decided that a nature reserve for the local community to enjoy, would be an innovative addition to the Parish. Therefore, a small parcel of land of nearly 2 acres at the top of Swanley Park was set aside in the year 2000.

Advice was sought from The Conservation Volunteers (TCV) and North West Kent Countryside Project about suitable wildflower plants, trees and shrubs to attract wildlife to the area. In Spring 2001 the scheme started with over 40 volunteers helping to plant 1 400 wild flower plug plants and 25 trees and shrubs. Following this initial planting, volunteers formed the Swanley and District Environment Group continued work in the nature reserve since 2001, adding new hedge areas, planting many trees, creating habitats, paths, wild flower areas, bug hotels and making bird boxes for the area.

The group was renamed "Swanley Wildlife And Nature Group" in January 2010.

The group joined TCV and have regular working parties throughout the year to further their work. Children including local Cub, Scout, Brownie groups and local schools have had educational fun identifying trees, birds and flowers in the area and helping out. Around 1000 hedgerow trees have so far been planted in the nature reserve. Volunteers from the community have spent over 2000 hours working on activities since the group's conception. Swanley Town Council support the group by carrying out tasks such as grass strimming and mowing paths.

We have achieved environmental awards for our work in the community including a Silver Gilt award for South East In Bloom 2019.

The group has also undertaken environmental community work within the parish. Examples are Churchyard clearance at St Mary's Church, Swanley and St Paul's Church, Swanley Village. In November 2018, an acre of land in Swanley Park was planted up with over 600 tree saplings to form a WW1 remembrance wood/area. In autumn 2019, 1000 mixed spring bulbs were planted in the area by the community.

The group has arranged an itinerary of events, which can be accessed on our Facebook site (search Swanley Wildlife and Nature Group) or their website. If you would like to come along to take part in any of the activities, then please let us know.





# Swanley's Abandoned Trolleys

For many years Swanley residents have endured supermarket trolleys littering their streets and green open spaces due to the inconsiderate actions of a minority.

It should be noted that removal of trolleys from the boundary of a store represents theft. Swanley Town Council have had several meetings and numerous telephone conversations with the management team at Asda and Aldi in an attempt to resolve this potentially dangerous issue.

Unattended trolleys can easily roll into the path of oncoming vehicles, particularly when left at bus stops causing accidents.

Apart from being unsightly, some appropriated trolleys are being used to convey household waste and this represents a potential health hazard if these are not thoroughly cleaned upon return.

Just over a year ago, Asda agreed to install a magnetic barrier around the perimeter of their store and at the same time they applied a magnetic lock to a front wheel on all of their trolleys.

Initially this worked well, however, as not all had been converted, some customers still managed to remove trolleys from the store.

Trollywise (0800 316 1241) have a weekly collection service for Swanley and they collect abandoned trolleys on behalf of both Asda and Aldi.

However, Swanley Town Council regularly gather and store in excess of 70 trolleys weekly awaiting collection from Trollywise.

In an attempt to eradicate the problem of abandoned trolleys in the Sevenoaks district, Sevenoaks District Council have applied for a licence to operate within the Environmental Act.

This will facilitate the ability to apply charges for both the collection and storage of abandoned supermarket trolleys throughout all areas of Sevenoaks district.

However, the prime area of concern is Swanley where there are three supermarkets in the town centre, all within walking distance of the homes of the majority of residents.

A period of three months' notice will be given to the respective stores and as the application was only made in December 2019, we will have to wait until the end of March to enforce our intentions.
