This is in addition to more than £350,000 invested last year, creating a larger Splash Pool which was enjoyed by more that 8000 people during the summer whilst adhering to Government guidelines.

Swanley Town Council does not receive any funding from Government or Sevenoaks District Council towards the maintenance of Swanley Park and the income from park operations is crucial to sustain investment to make improvements in the park each year.

The Soft Play is known as 'The Barnyard' a farm themed facility set across three floors. 'The Barnyard', is available for daily

walk-in sessions as well as bookings for both individual sessions and parties.

Other investments made in Swanley Park over the last 12 months by Swanley Town Council include:-

- Moving and increasing the size of the Hand Boat Pool
- Relocating the Waterslide to a designated water area
- Replacing the safety surface for the outside playground near the café
- Upgrading the toilet facilities
- Improvements to paths around the parks

Swanley Town Council takes pride in ensuring Swanley Park is a space for everyone to relax, play and exercise and staff work tirelessly to keep the park clean and tidy and to a high standard.

Swanley Town Council is hoping to attain the Green Flag Award for the fourth year in a row, and has also entered the South & South East In Bloom Award a row having obtained a Silver

Patient Voice

As you will be aware, this is still a challenging time for the NHS, and GP practices continue to balance the vaccination process, the threat of new variants and ongoing patient care.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, The Oaks Surgery has provided an accessible service for patients and currently offers face to face appointments for patients for blood tests, annual reviews, immunisation, cervical smears, NHS Health Checks, nursing appointments etc.

The current operating model for GP appointments consists of a telephone triage phone call first.

At this stage many patients can be diagnosed and treated either by telephone or video call; those patients requiring face to face appointments following a telephone or video consultation are offered a face-to-face appointment with a GP.

The Practice also uses eConsult for online advice, administrative assistance and requests for telephone appointments.

The Oaks has been actively involved in running many Saturday COVID-19 vaccination clinics alongside the roll out at the Alexandra Suite in Swanley - which continues with all adult patients over 18 now invited to attend.

The NHS App is extremely useful for patients to help with ordering repeat prescriptions, viewing COVID status, vaccination records and to access other NHS services.


The Patient Voice is currently producing another Newsletter to keep our patients up to date.

WATCH OUT for the Swanley Neighbourhood Plan week in October 2021!

The Swanley Neighbourhood Plan is getting very close to completion.

The Steering Group of residents who are volunteers preparing the Plan have worked hard to collect evidence – on parking, open spaces, future housing development, community facilities and so

They have also drafted planning policies that Sevenoaks will have to take into consideration when making decisions on planning applications for Swanley.

The group is making the case that Swanley is a distinctive place that is important to local residents and that its character should be enhanced and protected:

- We are proposing that Swanley is not a place for high buildings and we want to prevent more of them coming forward for approval
- We are not proposing any new development sites in the plan
- We have prepared detailed design guidelines for Swanley Village to protect its special character
- We propose to prevent loss of Swanley's Green Belt and its open spaces and parks and sports and community facilities.
- We propose to improve the quality of new housing that will be built both on sites that Sevenoaks have agreed for the Local Plan that they are preparing (we cannot do anything about that - Central Government demands new housing from all Districts) and others than come forward to apply for planning permission on existing sites such as Broom Hill and **Swanley Lane**
- We propose to make sure we have a new health facility that is in the centre of the town and includes all the facilities that our local surgeries want.

If you care about Swanley, watch out for events that will be taking place - tell everyone you know and make sure you bring your friends and family.

You will get a leaflet through your door and it will be on the Town Council Website.

Come and let us know what you think of what we have done so far.

Swanley Town Council is pleased to announce that on the 29th June 2021 we obtained "leader" status through the disability confident scheme.

There are only six other businesses in Kent which have received this accreditation, and Swanley Town Council is the first council in Kent to obtain this accolade which is valid until 26th June 2024.

paperwork and social media posts.

Our journey towards this recognition began back in February 2021. Toni Roast, Assistant Town Clerk said "It is a fantastic achievement to obtain this highest level of recognition in such a short space of time.

When completing our level two paperwork, it was obvious that we already had in place most of what was needed to obtain the accreditation".

Since being recognised as a Disability Committed Employer in February, Swanley Town Council staff have received training in working with people who are on the Autistic Spectrum and working with people who have selective mutism.

This has been extremely beneficial and has already produced great results throughout the team and further training courses are planned.

THE ORCHARDS ALL CHANGE?

MEMORIES OF THE CLASSROOM



I began my senior education at Swanley School, as The Orchards was then known, in 1980. Back then, it was a school that catered for over 2000 students, organised into seven Houses, with a twoclass intake per House.

We were exposed to a huge selection of subjects and gained experience that could feed into a number of careers.

Subjects such as pottery, woodwork, metal work, technical drawing, art, needlework, home economics (cooking to the plain speakers), music and a vast array of sports were all part of the standard curriculum.

Facilities at the school were amazing for those days. Lower School, which was later sold to make way for housing, had 4 rugby pitches, 6 netball courts, an athletics track, high jump, long jump pits and Upper School (the sole remaining part) had 3 netball courts, a full size hockey pitch, gymnasium and sports hall.

When I left Swanley School I felt that I had received a well-rounded education that had equipped me with the tools necessary to enable me to be successful in whatever I chose to pursue.

When I returned to The Orchards for the first time some four years ago, I nearly cried. Students now have vastly reduced facilities and are clearly suffering from a lack of investment.

Today, sporting facilities are much reduced to just a hockey pitch, gym and sports hall, and the school's very fabric is in need of some serious TLC.

Although the teaching staff remain enthusiastic, encouraging and completely dedicated, that is clearly not matched by the fabric of the building.

Despite the poor building, Nick Gibb has written to Orchards Academy to commend the school's results and to comment on what an outstanding job staff do there; it is clearly a school worthy of investment.

The school now has a waiting list for places and has been asked in recent years to take students over their expected numbers, so it is clear that Orchards Academy is valued by the local community.

Around the time that I returned to The Orchards, I was coaching netball at various schools across SE London, witnessing first-hand the vast differences between the facilities at state versus public educational establishments.

The children who attend schools in the poorest areas and those who attend privately funded schools will all be competing for the same jobs and opportunities as they move through life.

I firmly believe that all children have the right to an excellent education, regardless of wealth or circumstance. Everyone should have the opportunity to reach their maximum potential if they are prepared to put in the effort, hard work and dedication.

The Orchards has suffered years of financial neglect, and as a consequence, student's access to a range of experiences has been shaved away.

Without the chance to access and learn different skills, as I did and other children still do, Orchard's pupils will have less exposure to new challenges and opportunities and the world of employment will be less open to them.

We are, however, able to make this better. I was voted to represent White Oak ward in the 2019 elections, securing a position on both the Town and District councils.

Having grown up in Swanley, worked here, commuted from and raised a family here, I am fully aware of the constraints that some may feel we have.

This is why I am delighted that our MP, Laura Trott, has taken up the baton and raised the issue of the lack of investment at the school at the very highest levels.

Her campaigning has led Prime Minister, Boris Johnson, to comment on the school during question time earlier in the year, when Laura raised the issue of additional funding for the school.

MP Laura Trott is also currently campaigning to have the whole school building rebuilt. Sevenoaks District Council and Kent County Council have also pledged to invest in The Orchards and, together with money awarded to the school from the Community Infrastructure Fund, will ensure the sports hall and changing rooms are given a much deserved and needed make-over very shortly.

In addition, TKAT, the schools governing body, have promised to resurface the 3G pitch, originally the hockey pitch, at the rear of the school, in phase two of this sporting refurbishment.

These much needed enhancements will improve the school experience for the children.

We need to ensure our children not only carry on receiving the

best tuition, but also that they benefit from state of the art facilities and the opportunities that a total rebuild, which Laura is now working for, will bring.

We need to inspire them at school so that they feel confident to strive for more in life.

This is only obtainable by making them aware of the huge array of opportunities that are available to them, and providing them with facilities equal to and beyond the requirements needed in this diverse and changing world we live in.

Being just thirty minutes from London, and experiencing shortages of engineers, builders, carpenters, children in Swanley have the world at their feet and should feel that they have the education foundation to rise to meet those challenges they wish to undertake.

How else will they aspire to

maximise their inner potential and make a better life for themselves?


Laura's campaign is currently being reviewed by Government and we hope The Orchards secures central funding to develop and rebuild the school in its entirety.


