NOTICE is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL, in exercise of its powers under Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), to install a pedestrian crossing as described in column 1 of Schedule 1 hereto, at the location as described in column 2 of the said Schedule.

A plan showing the location of the proposed zebra crossing may be inspected during normal office hours at Kent Highways, Transportation & Waste, Ashford Highway Depot, Henwood Industrial Estate, Unit 4 Javelin Way, Ashford, Kent TN24 8AD by appointment booked through traffic.schemes@kent.gov.uk from the 21 January 2022 or viewed online at www.kent.gov.uk/highwaysconsultations until 12 noon on Monday 14 February 2022. If you require further information on the proposed scheme, please contact Kent Highways and Transportation at the above address or at traffic.schemes@kent.gov.uk quoting scheme ref: 2122-LTP-SE-0001. Works will commence on the 12 February taking around 1 week. The existing double yellow lines and school keep clear marking will be removed.

St Marys Road, Swanley, Sevenoaks



What we plan to do

Kent County Council are planning to install a zebra crossing on St Marys Road, Swanley, outside the Dawn to Dusk Nursery. As part of the works we shall also be carrying out some resurfacing of the road. Please see a plan of what we are going to do on the third page.

When we plan to carry out the work and how long it will take

The work will take around **1 week** to complete, commencing on **12th February** (including weekends). The works will be in two phases – part one of the works will be carried out under traffic lights during the day, for 5 days, between the hours of **7am** and **7pm**. The second part will be under a road closure, during the night, for 2 nights, between the hours of **7.30pm** and **5am**.

This type of work can be affected by bad weather, so if it is not possible for us to carry it out at this time, we will arrange a new date and let you know via a letter drop to your home. We will also put up signs along the road, before we start, showing the date we plan to start work.

How will we carry out the works and how it will affect you

The works will be undertaken in two sections. Part of the works will be under traffic lights, during the day, for 5 days and for the second part it will be necessary to close the road completely, for 2 nights, so that we can carry out the works safely for both the workforce and road users. Please see a plan of the diversion route, on the next page. The diversion route will be:

St Marys Road – B2173 London Road – Oliver Road – Lime Road – Hart Dyke Road – St Marys Road and vice versa.

Why are we doing this work?

Kent County Council are installing this crossing to assist safer pedestrian movements across a busy carriageway. This will be of particular benefit to people accessing the local schools, nurseries, shops and the elderly community. The new crossing will also provide a safer link between the bus stops on either side of the carriageway. The scheme will seek to encourage slower vehicle speeds and assist in improving road safety in the vicinity of the schools. This scheme is being funded by the Local Transport Plan (LTP) block allocation for 2021/22. We have a legal duty to produce a LTP to demonstrate to Kent's residents and local businesses our strategies and priorities to make sure transport is playing its part in making Kent a great place to live, work and do business. Our current LTP can be found on our website www.kent.gov.uk.

How you can help us

We need your help to make sure the work is done as quickly as possible and to the best possible quality. We want to complete the works as quickly as we can and without causing you too much inconvenience. If your vehicle is usually parked on the carriageway, please make sure you park it somewhere else away from the site whilst the works are carried out.

For your safety and the safety of our workforce, please drive carefully and slowly through the roadworks.

Feedback from our workers shows that too many drivers go too fast through roadworks. Everyone is entitled to a safe workplace and our staff work next to moving traffic and risk injury every day to maintain and improve the highway for everyone.

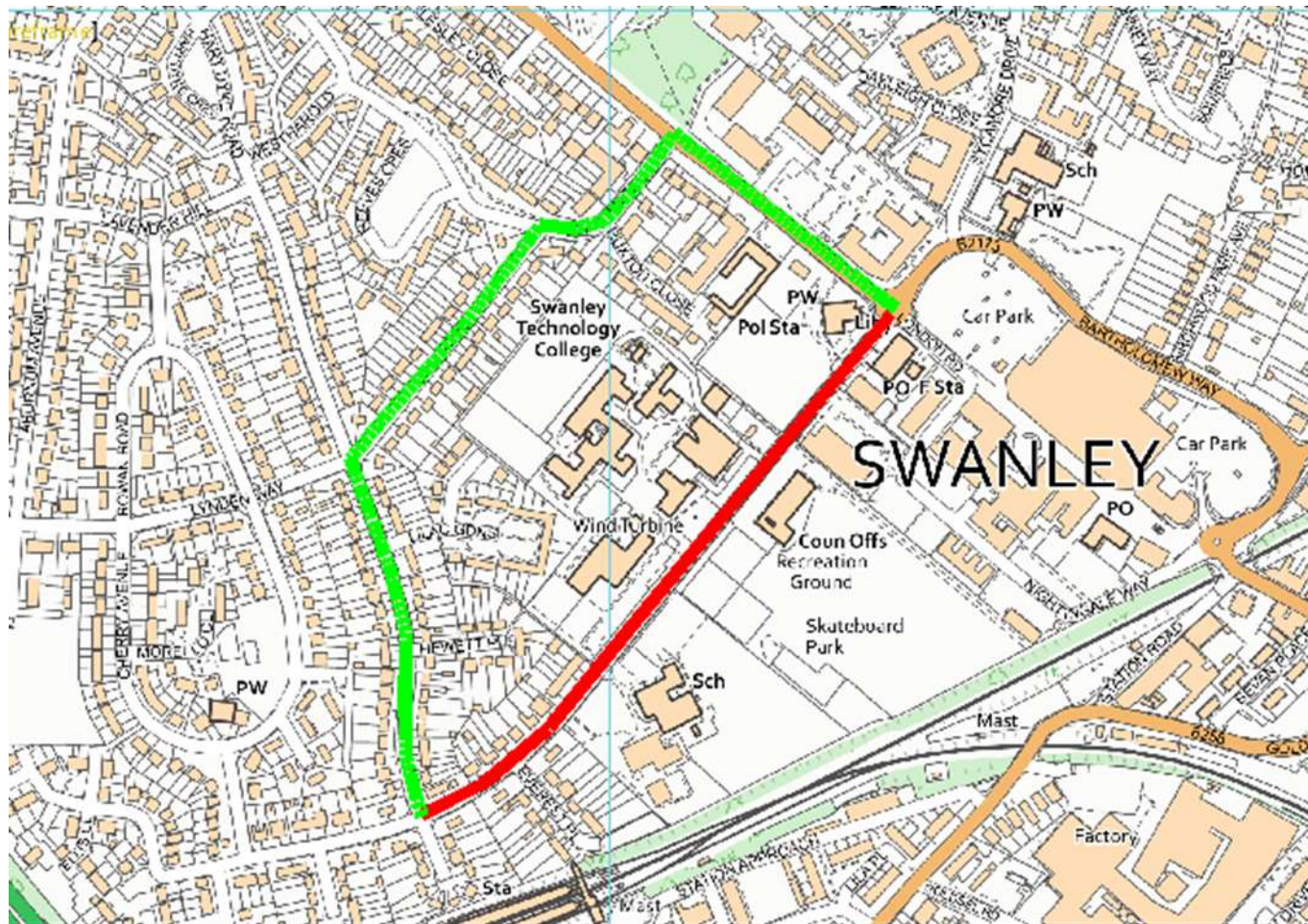

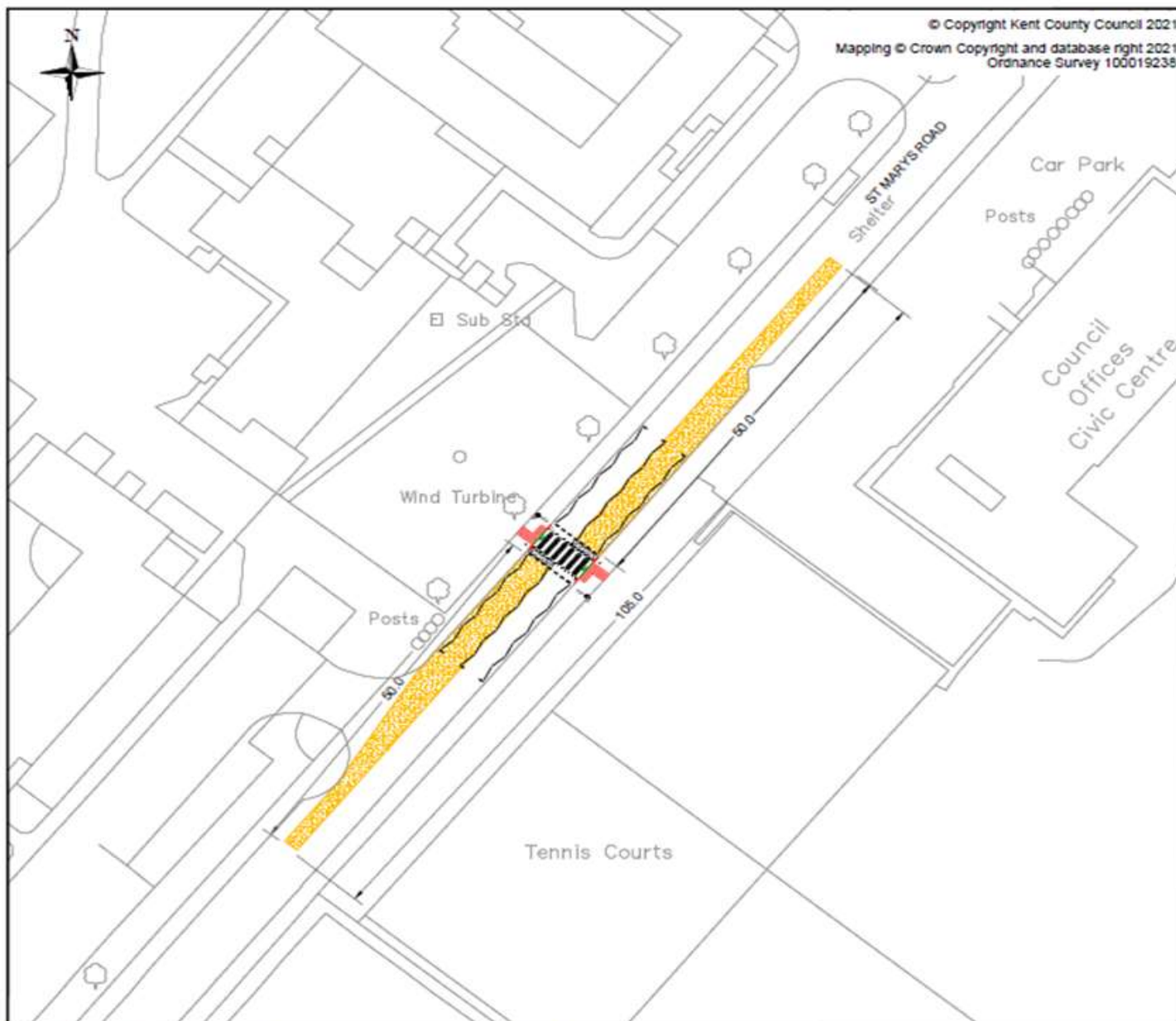
