In the Town Centre, we have been working with The Cedars, The Oaks, NHS England and the new centre owners on progressing plans to improve Swanley's health services.

The good news is we now have a preferred site and basic plan agreed between all parties for the provision of a new Health Hub facility.

Should these plans come to fruition, then residents would benefit from more services and appointments.

In 2018 and with support from the Heritage Lottery Fund, local business and Councillors, Swanley Town Council installed 112 stainless steel silhouettes on the 'ASDA' wall running through the middle of town.

This was a mark of respect to those who gave their lives in WW1. Now Swanley has expanded its remembrance tribute.

Two statues coined the 'Unknown Woman' have been installed on the same wall.

These special edition statues are designed to help the nation commemorate and recognise the bravery and sacrifices of women in war.

They have been purchased directly from the Royal British Legion.

This means funds have gone to the charity which provides financial, social and emotional support to members and veterans of the British Armed Forces, their families and dependants.

Leader of Swanley Town Council Michael Horwood said: "We wanted to ensure the memorial not only

commemorated the brave soldiers who gave their lives fighting for their country and our freedom, but also recognised the unsung work of Swanley women working on the frontline and locally to contribute to the war efforts, with many still experiencing the horrors of war."

Chief Executive Officer Ryan Hayman commented "It is important to keep the tribute alive in all our minds.

This latest addition is part of that plan, and it is an overdue mark of respect remembering the important role women played serving their country."

Town Mayor Councillor Paul Darrington added "Swanley has a great recent history in providing lasting tributes for remembrance day.

The town already has a range of memorial benches and plaques in commemoration of our armed forces and now we also have statues of women who served their country.

We do not want to stop there and hope to add to these tributes in 2022."

Since last year's floods and as a result of the public meetings held last Autumn, working with Swanley Town Council and partners, I wanted to bring you up to date with what is being done to tackle the issue of surface water flooding in Swanley.

- Noticeable uplift in contractors tending to drains and gullies throughout Autumn/Winter '21
- Many roads susceptible to flooding now included on the Enhanced Maintenance schedule. This means they benefit from twice yearly inspections. Where problems arise between inspections, they are attended to within 7 days rather than the standard 28-day response.
- Full CCTV survey to be undertaken of the drainage system across Swanley
- Surface water flood risk survey to be undertaken by external professional company
- External agencies to improve and better maintain existing assets
- The implementation in certain areas of 'Flood Bins'
- The likely addition of flood doors to some 'at risk' properties
- Investigation work being carried out at various locations with a view to improving drainage
- New technologies being looked at such as Smart Drains – to automatically monitor systems
- Negotiations underway to provide quick response aid from locally stored flood kits inc. pumps, sandbags etc
- Introduction of local 'Flood Wardens' to areas with a history of flooding. More volunteers needed.

If you see a problem with a drain or gulley, please log the fault on the KCC website or App under Roads and Travel 'Report a Problem', or by calling 03000 418181 during normal hours or 03000 419191 out of hours or in an emergency.

Please help us to help you by not depositing waste materials into the drain system – especially building materials such as sand and cement.

Swanley Park creates new accessible toilet and changing facility for disabled users

Swanley Town Council is very pleased to announce the recent development and installation of a brand new 'Changing Places' toilet facility for disabled users of Swanley Park.

This is the latest addition to the park, and complements the Water Park and Play Park areas which are also inclusive by design.

This project was part funded through grants and donations.

The grants totalled £12,500 with the total project costing nearly £20,000. Swanley Town Council wish to thank; The National Lottery; The Bruce Wake Trust; and Crowdfunding for their generous donations.

Changing Places are designed so that they are completely accessible and provide sufficient space and equipment for people who are not able to use the toilet independently.

This facility consists of suitable equipment such as; an electric changing table; electric hoist; adjustable sink; new railings; and a privacy screen.

Swanley's Mayor Cllr Paul Darrington opened the facility and commented "Due to the recent pandemic, parks and open spaces have played a key role in society, improving the wellbeing of local communities. It is paramount that all visitors have facilities they are able to use where they feel safe and comfortable.

We are very proud to be one of the 1653 locations providing a Changing Places facility in the UK".

Need2Change, a local movement pushing for better facilities, also attended the opening and added "It is fantastic to be at the opening of this Changing Places toilet.

Having a toilet with the specialist equipment needed, makes such a difference and is a very tangible demonstration that places care and ensures people feel that they are welcomed.

We'd like to extend our gratitude to all involved in the project and we very much look forward to future visits with our friends and families.






