> > it most. For some parents it's a particular struggle because they are also having to cope with issues such as postnatal depression, their

own or their child's illness or disability, isolation or multiple birth.

Home-Start is made up of local volunteers who have parenting experience themselves, and they regularly visit families in their own home, offering emotional and practical support through difficult times.

I truly look forward to serving as your Mayor for the coming year, and hope to meet the many Swanley community groups over the coming year. Our CEO

This year, due to the local elections, the spring Town Crier has been delayed and combined with the summer addition. This is timely given that the lengthy winter weather appears to finally be behind us. I warmly welcome eleven new and five re-elected Councillors to Swanley Town Council and look forward to working with them all over the next four years. I also want to say thank you to all those who stood and to everyone who voted. Many Parishes have uncontested elections, but Swanley was fully contested.

Floral summer arrangements are out across the town, with several new additions this year and a growing number of sustainable plants helping us maximise value and environmental benefits. A total of 3771 tress have been planted across three sites; West View

Park; Elephant Park; Pinks Hill. A wildflower bund has also been built at Pinks Hill along with work starting to expand the balancing pond. All these works at Pinks Hill have helped with flood prevention; at Elephant Park they have increased the screen between the Park and the busy A20, and the planting at West View Park has helped protect the site from future housing development schemes. All areas will

now have improved air quality whilst giving a boost to the local eco-system.

At Swanley Park, a new inflatable area has been built providing a bigger activity for children to enjoy and at the same time cutting queue wait times thanks to the increased capacity. Work is well underway for the new Children's Nursery facility to be operated by Dawn to Dusk (Swanley), a local family business based at Orchards Academy. This new £1.5 million pound facility has not cost the Town Council a penny but will provide a long-term sustainable income stream, meaning we can invest more into the Park. Orchards Academy is due to be rebuilt, with working due to start this autumn after a minor delay, as the original start date had been planned for March 2023. The new facility should be completed within 18 months, costing an estimated £30 million and all paid for through the Governments 'Levelling Up' fund.

The Venues in recent times have been invested in like never before. The latest upgrade are new toilet facilities at the Alexandra Suite, with work taking place in-house. A fleet EV charger has been installed at the Civic/Alexandra Suite Car Park and will supplement the chargers at The Olympic which I mentioned in the last update. Investment into our Venues is important, we previously lost the Woodlands because it reached a point of uneconomic repair. This cannot happen again as our Venues are vital facilities for the Town. We will continue to make enhancements throughout 2023. Ryan M Hayman





National Highways and Swanley Town Council Champion Biodiversity with the Planting of Over 3,500 Native Trees Along the M25

National Highways recently revealed details of work being carried out to protect and enhance the environment surrounding the M25 in Kent.

National Highways, together with Swanley Town Council, is currently carrying out improvements at the Pinks Hill balancing pond near Swanley, Kent just beside Junction 3 of the M25.

As part of this project, the team at Connect Plus and Connect Plus Services (National Highways contractors on the M25) have helped to plant over 3,500 trees across three sites close to the pond itself.

All the plants will be native, both trees and the wildflower seed mix, and they all add something to wildlife such as fruits/nuts and all are used as invertebrate food plants.

Francis Cluett, from National Highways lead said, "We are delighted to join the Council to plant near Pinks Hill. These tree planting schemes at Pinks Hill will deliver real benefits for people living nearby. These new trees are part of our plans to ensure the local environment is improved.

"We recognise that the M25 at Swanley runs close to some exceptionally beautiful countryside and we want to make sure it stays that way, so that's why the team from Connect Plus Services will be visiting regularly to check on the condition of the trees."

Those trees planted have been chosen from the following species: Yew, Hazel, Dog Rose, Rowan, Spindle, Crab Apple, Silver Birch, Beech, Hawthorn,

Small-leaved Lime, Sweet Chestnut, Field Maple, Elder, Wild Privet, Wayfaring Tree, Dogwood and Wild Cherry.

Ryan Hayman, Swanley Town Council's CEO concluded: "These three planting schemes will benefit biodiversity in Swanley.

I look forward to seeing how they will help open up these local spaces for the benefit of residents, visitors, and the wider community. The Town Council is committed to being Carbon Neutral by 2030 and projects like these are part of our overall strategic aim".

Speed Watch Volunteers needed

Are you concerned about the speed of vehicles on the roads in and around Swanley?

If the answer is yes, then are you interested in training to be a Speed Watch Volunteer?

Training will be provided by Kent Police under their speed watch scheme and this consists of a 40 – 50 minute online training followed by one hour's training at the roadside. Insurance cover is provided for all roadside operations.

All sites are risk-assessed prior to any speed watch procedures.

Six volunteers are required in order to set up as a volunteer organisation.

Signs have been popping up across Swanley asking local people to have a friendly chat with regards to everyday objects as part of our 'Hello Lamp Post' project.

The signs have been put up in Swanley Park, St Mary's Recreation Ground and Swanley Train Station inviting residents to say 'hello'.

If the trial is a success, the Hello Lamp Post project will be rolled out to other towns and villages across the District. Hello Lamp Post is supported by Swanley Town Council, Sevenoaks District

Council, Southeastern and is part of the District's 'Better Together Community Hub' project.















